10. Persecuted Church: Dibouti -Diibouti is mainland Africa's third smallest nation. It is dominated by two majority-Muslim groups, the Afar and Somali, and is nearly surrounded by parts of neighboring countries that serve as safe havens for Islamic terrorists. Despite this, Djibouti itself is not dominated by extremists. The capital hosts many foreigners, and international aid groups operate freely out of the country. Even though Islam is the official state religion, the rights of Christians are generally respected, Bibles are legally available and there is no law preventing Muslims from converting. Still, Diibouti seeks to maintain its Muslim identity, and Christian organizations are not allowed to officially register. 98 percent of Djiboutians are Sunni Muslims. 1 percent are Christians.

- Pray for unity among front-line workers in the country.
- Pray for continued stability so persecuted believers from surrounding nations can take refuge there.
- Pray that Somali and Eritrean refugees will have the opportunity to hear the gospel.
- Pray for Christian converts from Islam, who face pressure and persecution from their communities.
